- I, IBRAHIM ODUOR, an Advocate of the High Court of Kenya who have the conduct of this matter on behalf of the Petitioner HEREBY CERTIFY that the Notice of Moti on filed herewith is EXTREMELY URGENT and deserves to be placed before the Honourable Judge immediately for the following REASONS:
  - 1. That on 21st June 2020, in a show of unbridled impunity and contempt to the fundamental human rights of its employees, the Respondent vide a text message sent out in the middle of the night, summarily terminated the Interested Parties Employment, in a process that was unfair, unlawful and outrightly inhumane and continues to withhold their salaries for the months of April, May June, payment in lieu of notice as well as other lawful terminal dues.
  - 2. That the Petitioner requires records and documentation exclusively held by the Respondent, to wit, criteria for alleged redundancy as well as computation of the purported of terminal dues payable to the Interested Parties. The same are required for purposes of protection of the rights of the Interested Parties hence this application is brought under Article 35 (1) (b) of the Constitution as well as under the Inherent powers of this Honourable Court, and particularly for determination of this suit.
